


Cardiff has developed a fine reputation as a world class sporting events city over recent years. Named as the European Capital of Sport in 2014, the quality of our facilities continues to attract major international events. The highlights of Cardiff's host city CV include the 2012 Olympics, 2015 Rugby World Cup, 2017 UEFA Champions League Final, the 2018 Volvo Ocean Race and the 2022 WWE Clash at the Castle.

SEE OUR TEAMS IN ACTION

Cardiff is proud to boast 4 successful, top level sports teams, all based here in the city. With these teams in town there is always an incredible choice of sporting action right on our doorstep. So, get ready to support our teams and make some noise!



Cardiff City are a professional association football club currently playing in the EFL Championship; however, they have brought Premier League football to the city twice in the last 10 years, most recently in 2019.

Cardiff Devils are a British Elite Ice Hockey League team and narrowly missed out on a third consecutive title in the final match of the 2019 season, they are the current reigning EIHL Playoff Champions.

Cardiff Rugby play at the famous Cardiff Arms Park and compete in the United Rugby Championship. Cardiff brought silverware home as recently as 2018 with their victory in the European Challenge Cup.

Glamorgan Cricket are the only first-class county team based in Wales and play their home matches at Sophia Gardens on the banks of the river Taff, Glamorgan clinched their first silverware for 17 years in 2021 as they won the Royal London Cup.


